


Harry Potter and the Sorcerer's Stone

This activity is designed to support the Common Core State Standards through student-based discussions, re-reading of the text and quote analysis.

CCSS reading literature strand 5: "Explain how a series of chapters, scenes, or stanzas fit together to provide the overall structure of a particular story, drama or poem"

Students must analyze specific events from the novel and determine the sequence of these events. They must recall relevant details and use reasoning to complete this activity. They will analyze how events build upon one another and how chronological order helps give structure and meaning to this story.



Student Directions:

For this chronological order sort, put the events in order. Refer back to Harry Potter and the Sorcerer's Stone if necessary.

Discuss with your partner or group how you know the events are in order. How does the order impact the story? How do the chapters build on one another? Why does the story have to be told a certain way? Why do events happen in a particular order? What would happen if certain events didn't happen? How might that impact the story? Discuss these questions and come up with your own as you work quietly on this station.



TEACHER INSTRUCTIONS

1. Print out the cards and instructions on printer paper or cardstock. (White or colored paper is fine)


I would recommend laminating the pages for durability.

3. Go over instructions with students and make copies of the novel Harry Potter and the Sorcerer's Stone available as a reference.




A mysterious letter arrives for a Mr. H. Potter, cupboard under the stairs at Number Four, Privet Drive.




Harry and Ron become friends with Hermione after defeating the troll in the girls' bathroom.




Harry is nicknamed "the boy who lived".




Harry is sorted into Gryffindor after asking the Sorting Hat not to put him into Slytherin.




The wand, containing

him with a pig's tail.




Draco Malfoy unsuccessfully

Harry decides to stay at Hogwarts for winter break and is surprised by presents from the Weasley family.


Hermione believes that Professor Snape is cursing Harry's broom during his first Quidditch match, so she sets his robes on fire.

Harry.




Neville breaks his wrist

broomstick.




Harry, Ron and Hermione
accidentally meet Fluffy.




Harry, Ron and Hermione

most unlikely place.




Harry receives the cloak

Ron sacrifices himself in wizard chess so that Harry can proceed in their quest.

Ron is delighted to learn that Hermione is very bad at wizard chess. He feels this is a good for her.

Harry gets to go to the zoo with the Dursleys after their neighbor breaks her leg.

Harry mentions a dream about a flying motorcycle, which causes Uncle Vernon to get very angry.

Harry learns that his parents left him a lot of wizard money at Gringotts.

Harry discovers the Mirror of Erised, which he later shows to Ron. The two ponder the mirror's meaning.

Harry uses the cloak of invisibility to sneak into the restricted section of the library.

Harry returns to the Dursleys, but doesn't plan to tell them that he can't use magic outside of Hogwarts.

Ron yells "are you a witch or not?" at Hermione when she freaks out.


Harry loses points for Gryffindor, but Ron cheers him up by telling Harry that Fred and George lose points all the time.

Harry lies to Professor Quirrel about what he sees in the Mirror of Erised.

Professor Dumbledore confesses that he sees himself holding socks in the Mirror of Erised.

Discuss: Why do the order of the events in the story matter?
